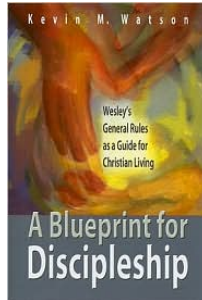

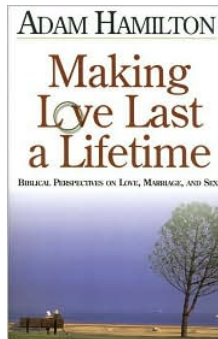

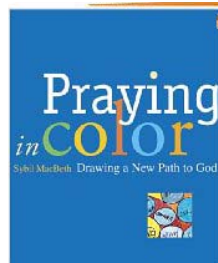


Making Love Last a Lifetime
