A Sunday school class shared the following excerpt from "Cure for the Common Life" by Max Lucado with me:  
*"Broken people come to churches. Not with broken bones, but with broken hearts, homes, dreams, and lives. They limp in on fractured faith, and if the church operates as the church, they find healing. Pastor-teachers touch and teach. Gospel bearers share good news. Prophets speak words of truth. Visionaries dream of greater impact. Some administer. Some pray. Some follow. But all help to heal brokenness to make the Body of Christ stronger."*

We, at New Haven UMC, are the church. We aren't buildings or a place, but rather, a family. A family, set apart by God to love and encourage each other as we journey through life. Many of us have been watching the news of the destruction of the earthquake in Haiti. And even though we are thousands of miles away... modern technology enables us to see the daily toll of lives and property lost. Pray for those who are experiencing this heartbreaking time in their life. Pray for the families of loved ones that were lost. Our hearts go out to our brothers and sisters in Christ.

When someone hurts, we hurt. Painful times in our lives are not easy. Many times people come to talk with me about some difficult times they are going through, and one of the first things I hear is that "their problems aren't anything compared to what others are going through." The reality is that we cannot compare our hurt with another's - there is no way to say what we feel is any less painful, any less significant, or any less life-altering than someone else's. But what we can say is: we hurt.

We all have been through hard times in our lives. Times when we need to rely on God and the church. Max Lucado says God heals his family through his family. God entrusts us, as the church, to be a significant part of his healing grace. No one is strong all the time. Let us be the church to one another, bear each other's burdens and offer to be that place of healing.

Pray for our brothers and sisters in Christ in Haiti, as well as those here among us. Be that teacher, Gospel bearer, prophet, visionary, administrator, prayer partner, leader or follower in this Body of Christ. It takes all of us to help heal brokenness in life.

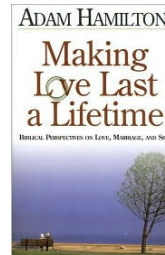

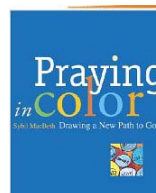


### Making Love Last a Lifetime

## UMW COLLECTING OLD EYEGLASSES FOR MEXICO

UMW President Bobbi Neal received an e-mail from daughter Rev. Wendi Neal asking for old pairs of eyeglasses for Mexico. For the past two years, she and husband Rev. Carlos Ramirez, have led a team from Elk City UMC on a VIM medical mission trip to a clinic outside Carlos' hometown of Puebla. It's a small, private clinic owned and operated by the Methodist Church of Mexico. In fact, Carlos' grandfather was the VIM head who was responsible for starting the clinic. It serves the people in the Tatoxcac/Zacapoaxtla area (mountains of the state of Puebla). The majority of the people are indigenous and descendants of the Aztecs.

This year, an optometrist is going with them, thus the need for eyeglasses. If you have any old pairs and would like to donate them to this effort, please give them to Bobbi or to any UMW member. So far, Wendi reports that they have collected 350 pairs, but they need around 500.
